State Total 2010 Census

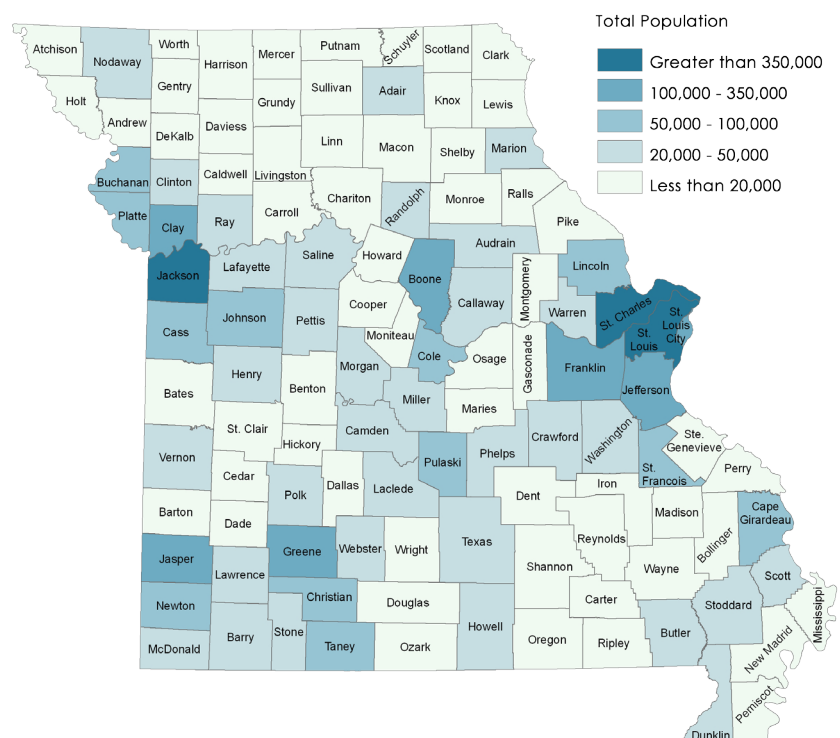
The 2010 Decennial Census publishes regional population demographics for ethnicity, race and age groups. This profile will feature county trends and statistics for the state of Missouri.

In 2010 Missouri had a total resident population of 5,988,927, ranking Missouri 18th among all U.S. states. A net growth of 393,716 persons between 2000 and 2010 represents a 7 percent growth rate.

St. Louis County, down from a population peak of 1,016,315 in 2000, had the largest 2010 population (998,954), representing 16.7 percent of the state's total estimated population. The other counties in the top five include Jackson, with a population of 674,158, St. Charles (360,485), St. Louis City (319,294) and Greene (275,174).

St. Louis City had the largest net loss of population, losing 28,895 between 2000 and 2010. St. Louis County was second with a loss of 17,361 persons, followed by Pemiscot (1,751), Scott (1,231) and Dunklin (1,202).

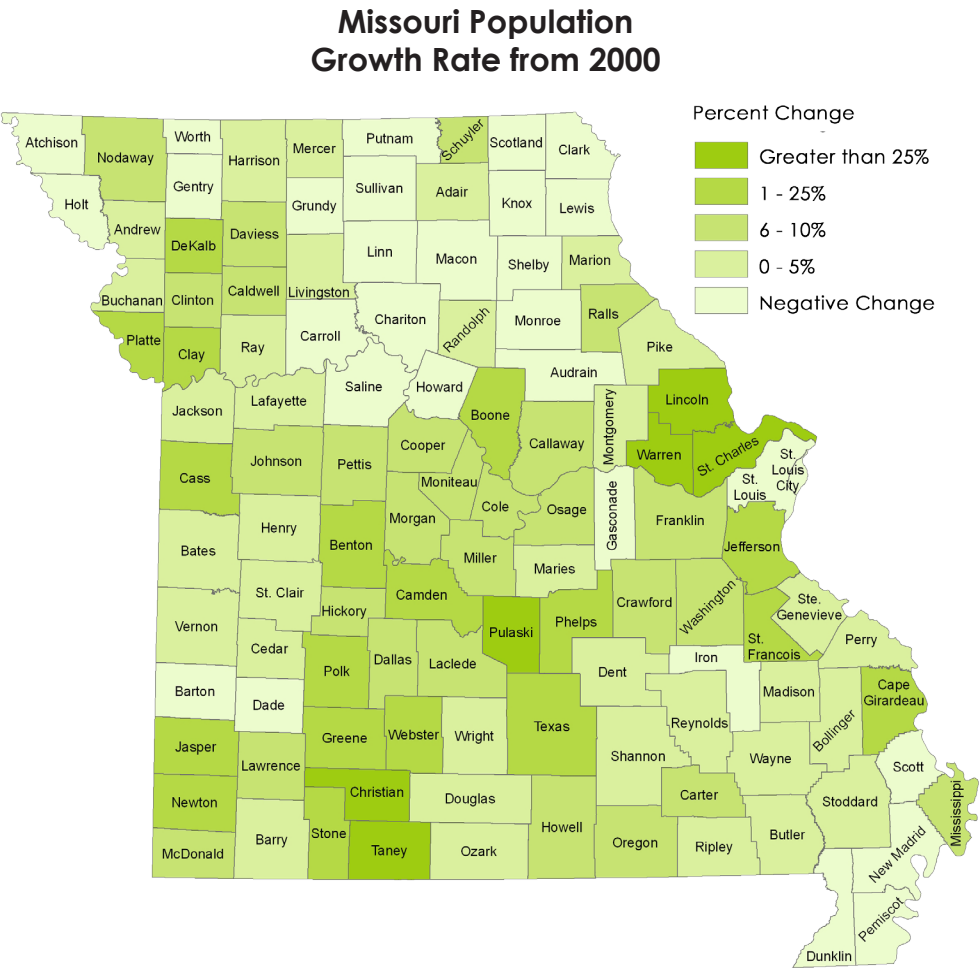
Total Missouri Population 2010



Population Growth

Missouri's average growth rate for the past 100 years is a little over 6 percent. The fastest growth was seen between 1990 and 2000 when the state's population percent change reached 9.34. The 2000's ranked as the fourth fastest decade of growth at 7.04 percent.

Christian County had the fastest growth between 2000 and 2010 at 42.6 percent, followed by Lincoln County (35.0%) and Warren County (32.6%). Thirty-six counties had growth rates exceeding Missouri's 7.0 percent. Conversely, 30 counties had negative growth rates between -0.5 and -11.6 percent.

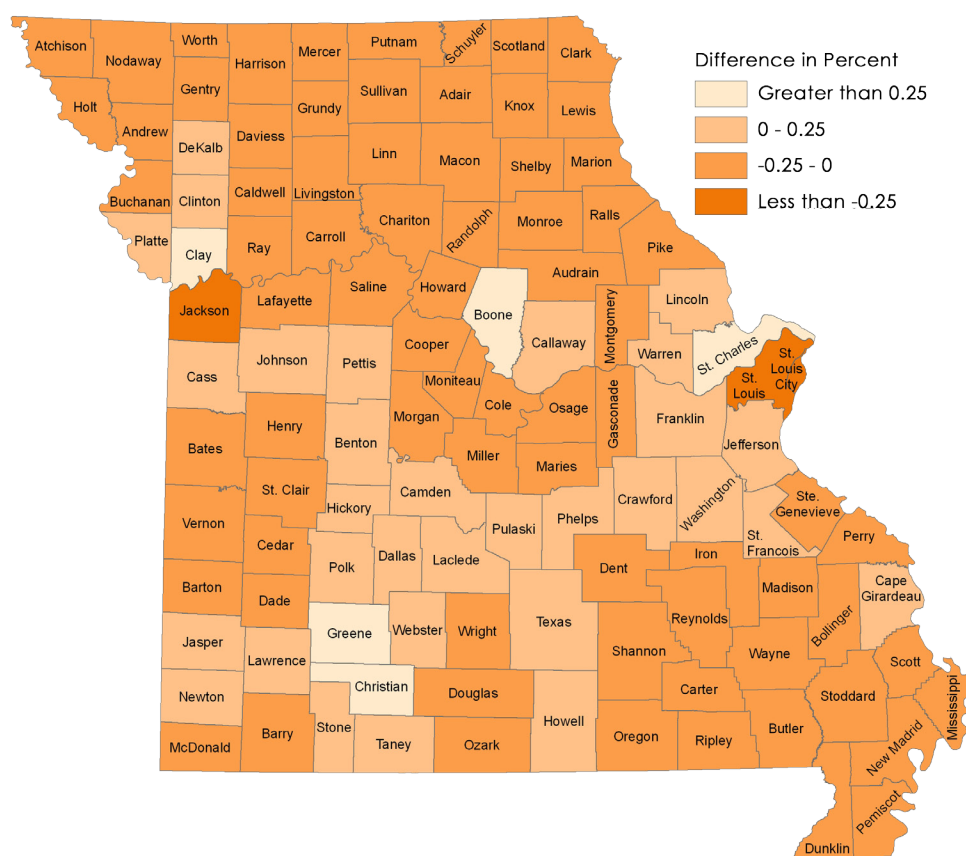

Population Share

St. Louis and Kansas City remain the largest population centers for Missouri. However, the 2000's saw a growing share of the state's population shift to the Ozarks, south west Missouri and the smaller metropolitan areas of Springfield, Columbia and Cape Girardeau. The greater St. Louis and Kansas City regions now host a greater share of Missouri's total population. St. Charles increased its percent of total population by 0.946 percent. It is followed by Clay (0.417%), Christian (0.323%), Greene (0.298%) and Boone (0.295%) counties.

Missouri also saw growth and shifts of its minority populations, including a 10 percent increase in the *Black or African American* population, a 9 percent increase in the *American Indian and Native Alaska* population, a 61 percent increase in the *Asian and Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander* population, and a 79 percent increase in the population of *Hispanic or Latino Origin*.
