

Central Region Industry Analysis

The Central Region is situated in the center of the State of Missouri. Counties included in the Central Region are: Audrain, Boone, Callaway, Camden, Cole, Cooper, Crawford, Dent, Gasconade, Howard, Laclede, Maries, Miller, Moniteau, Morgan, Osage, Phelps, Pulaski and Washington.

This region includes several major cities such as Columbia, Mexico, Rolla, Camdenton, Lebanon and the state capital, Jefferson City. Many of Missouri's major highways cross through this region. Interstate 44 runs through the southern part of the region, while Interstate 70 crosses the northern part of the region. In addition, Highway 50, Highway 54 and Highway 63 cross through the region, allowing a great deal of travel through the area.

Industry Employment Trends 2009 – 2014

The Central Region experienced overall employment growth since the 2008-09 recession, with employment growth of 3.7% from 2009 to 2014. Employment growth in the region was higher than statewide employment growth of 2.2% for the same period. Industries with the largest employment growth were *Social Assistance* (70.4%), *Administrative and Support Services* (40.1%), and *Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services* (18.1%). Two industries experienced employment loss: *General Merchandise Stores* (-12.8%) and *Hospitals* (-6.5%). Overall employment growth were in the service and health care industries.

Industry Wage Trends 2009 – 2014

The Central Region had overall wage growth of 7.8%, or over \$2,400, from 2009 to 2014, lower than the statewide average of 9.4%. Industries with the largest wage growth were *Credit Intermediation and Related Activities* (23.6%), *Motor Vehicle and Parts Dealers* (19.7%), and *Speciality Trade Contractors* (17.7%). The industries with the highest wages in 2014 were *Management of Companies and Enterprises* (\$53,304), *Insurance Carriers and Relatred Activities* (\$49,932), and *Ambulatory Health Care Services* (\$49,512).

Industry Employment Projections 2012 – 2022

Based on long-term industry employment projections nine industries, employing 5,000 or more, is estimated to have double-digit employment growth from 2012 to 2022. *Administrative and Support Services* industry is estimated to have 38.4% more employment (2,829 more jobs) by 2022. *Speciality Trade Contractors* industry employment is predicted to increase nearly 38% (or 2,349 more jobs). *Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services* industry employment is expected to grow by 24.8% (1,966 more jobs). Most of the industries in the top ten list for employment growth are in service-based and health care industry groups.

Industry Clusters and Top Employers

The Central Region's highly concentrated industries are mostly in the services sector as determined by the location quotient indicator. The location quotient (LQ) indicator describes how concentrated an industry is in a region in relation to the nation, with 1.00 being the national average. The most concentrated service industries in the Central Region were *Motor Vehicle and Parts Dealers, Nursing and Residential Care Facilities*, and *General Merchandise Stores*. The most concentrated production/manufacturing industries were *Machinery Manufacturing* and *Heavy and Civil Engineering Construction*.

The Central Region's largest private employers are based in Advanced Manufacturing, Financial/Professional Services, and Health Care Sciences and Services target industry groups. The largest employers in manufacturing are Scholastic, Scroll Compressors, and Kraft Foods. The largest employers in the financial/professional services industry are MetLife, State Farm Insurance, Veterans United Home Loans, and Shelter Insurance. Large employers in Health Care are Boone Hospital, University of Missouri Health Care, and Phelps County Regional Medical Center.
